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Introduction

This *NBIA 4.5 Installation Guide* provides you with the instructions to install and configure a fresh NBIA 4.5 application, or upgrade an existing 4.4.x application. The NBIA installation installs and configures two JBoss application servers and creates a NBIA-specific schema within a pre-existing database on a preinstalled MySQL server. An upgrade of NBIA converts an existing 4.4.x NBIA application and associated grid service to 4.5.

Directions are given in this document for both Linux and Windows operating systems.

NBIA 4.5 Software and Technology Requirements

Tested Environment	The NBIA 4.5 installation has been tested on Linux Red Hat Enterprise Linux AS 4 64/32-bit (for AMD chipset) and the Windows XP/2003 environments. While the installation may work in other Linux and Windows environments, it has only been tested in these environments.
Minimal Requirement Environment	The system requirement varies according to the capacity the system is planned for, such as concurrent users, number of images, etc. OS Windows or Linux server CPU – Intel 64-bit Core Duo processor or AMD Opteron HD – 160 GB SATA HD RAM – 3GB

Required Software—Not Included in NBIA

Many of the servers and services that make up NBIA 4.5 are automatically installed as part of this installation. However, there are certain tools that you must manually install and configure. These tools are listed in Table 1. The software name, version, description, and URL hyperlinks (for download) are indicated in the table.

Prior to the NBIA 4.5 installation, you must download and install the following tools and recommended versions in the order they are listed in Table 1. Complete the directions for installing each, as directed on the corresponding website.

As you install each application, record the installation directory path, and the hostname of your MySQL DB server, and the DB admin username/password.


Java SDK Installation

When you install the Java SDK, you are prompted to select the installation directory. Record the path, as this directory will be used when you set the environment variables.

Apache Ant Installation

- Unzip the Apache Ant distribution files using a command line unzip tool or a zip utility, such as WinZip.
- After extracting the zip, you must set the environment variables, described in the following section, so that Ant is available in the system PATH.

Apache Ant Environment Variables



The purpose of setting operating system environment variables is so that the Java SDK and Ant build tool are available to run from anywhere in the system.

Linux

To set the environmental variables in Linux, follow these steps:



The JAVA_HOME, ANT_HOME and PATH environment variables are set in /etc/profile. You may need to create the variables, or modify them if they already exist.

Step	Action
1	As the root user, enter the following in the /etc/profile file. A PATH variable should already be created in this file, so be sure to define the JAVA_HOME and ANT_HOME export before the PATH export. Replace <some_path> with the correct path fragment for Java and Ant installations.</some_path>
	export JAVA_HOME= <some_path>/jdk1.5.0_14</some_path>
	export ANT_HOME= <some_path>/apache-ant-1.7.0</some_path>
	export PATH=\$JAVA_HOME/bin:\$ANT_HOME/bin:\$PATH
2	Log out and log back in so that the system recognizes your changes.


Verifying the Environment Variables in Linux

To verify that environment variables have been set correctly, follow these steps:

Step	Action
	From the command line, enter:
1	echo \$JAVA_HOME echo \$ANT_HOME
	Both of these commands should return the location where you installed these tools.
2	To verify your Java SDK installation, enter <i>java -version</i> from a command prompt. You should see java version "1.5.0_14".
3	To verify your Ant installation, enter: <i>ant -version</i> from a command prompt. You should see: Apache Ant version 1.7.0 compiled on December 13 2006.

Windows

To set the environmental variables in Windows, follow these steps:



Step	Action
1	In Windows, select Control Panel , then select the Systems application. In the Systems window, select the Advanced tab.
2	 On the Advanced tab, click the Environment Variables button. To add a new system variable, select the New button. a. In the Variable <u>name</u> text box, enter <i>JAVA_HOME</i>. b. In the Variable <u>value</u> text box, enter the location of your Java installation. (e.g. c:\Program Files\Java\jdk1.5.0_14)
3	 Click the New button again. a. In the Variable <u>name</u> text box, enter ANT_HOME. b. In the Variable <u>value</u> text box, enter the location of your Ant installation. (e.g. C:\apache-ant-1.7.0).
4	Select the PATH system environment variable, and select the Edit button. This opens the Edit System Variable dialog box, displayed here as an example. Edit System Variable Variable name: PATH Variable value: Voltation (Cancel)
5	In the Variable value text box, prepend the following text in front of the text that already exists in the Variable Value field. <i>\$JAVA_HOME</i> %\ <i>bin;</i> %ANT_HOME%\ <i>bin;</i> Click OK .

Verifying the Environment Variables in Windows

Step	Action
	From the command line, enter:
1	echo %JAVA_HOME%
	echo %ANT_HOME%
	Both of these commands should return the location where you installed these tools.
2	To verify your Java SDK installation, enter <i>java -version</i> from a command prompt. You should see java version "1.5.0_14".
3	To verify your Ant installation, enter ant -version from a command prompt. You should see: Apache Ant version 1.7.0 compiled on December 13 2006.

To verify the environment variables have been set correctly, follow these steps:

MySQL Installation and Configuration

A MySQL 5.0.45 server must be downloaded, installed and running in order for the NBIA installation to work successfully.

To download and install MySQL, follow the steps outlined on the MySQL website: <u>http://downloads.mysql.com/archives.php?p=mysql-5.0&v=5.0.45</u>

 Record the MySQL root username/password chosen during the MySQL installation process, as you will need to use this as your database.system.user/database.system.password later in the NBIA installation process. Note the MySQL port chosen during the MySQL installation process as you will need to use this as your database.port later in the installation process. As part of the installation process, the default character set is set to latin1 for the NBIA MySQL database.

Once installed, you must configure My-SQL for NBIA (only for Linux).

Linux

Configure MySQL in Linux using the following steps:

Step	Action
	Lowercase Table Names in MySQL
1	Edit the /etc/init.d/mysqld (or mysql) file as follows:
	a. Locate the start() section and modify the mysqld_safe command (do not include the ellipses):

	b. Restart the MySQL service for the changes to take effect:
	Restart /etc/init.d/mysqld

Downloading and Installing UPT

If you do not already have a User Provisioning Tool (UPT) installed, and you wish to manage user accounts for your NBIA application, you **must** install UPT.

Overview of UPT UPT is used to provision users in the NBIA application. Each CBIIT application installs with its own Common Security Module (CSM) schema that has sample/default users and a role/permissions structure. To add additional users, you must provision the NBIA application as "NCIA" in the UPT. Then you can assign users to NBIA.

To download the NBIA 4.5 files, follow this step:

Installing NBIA One Component at a Time

	 When installing NBIA one component at a time, be aware of the following: The configuration parameters must agree across the components.
	A few examples: 1. All of the components should share the same database
	connection parameters.
Important	 The grid component must communicate with the JBoss web application so the JBoss host and port must agree between these two components.
	 The JBoss and database components both require configuration information about the guest account. These must agree.
	• Strictly speaking, there is not a rigid order in which the components must be installed. However, the database is likely the first thing to install since the installer will try to start all the other components and if the database is not there, the servers will show errors upon starting. These servers must be restarted after the database is installed.
	• The installer pages for the individual components are, for the most part, the same pages that are used when installing "Everything" so the documentation for the "Everything" path should largely apply.

Command-Line Method of Installation

About Properties

An important component of NBIA 4.5 command-line installation is configuring properties.

Overview of NBIA 4.5 Command-Line Installer Properties Files	When you do a command-line installation of NBIA 4.5 for the first time, you will work with the install.properties file included in the NBIA_install_4_5.zip.
	If you are using the command-line to upgrade from the previous version of NBIA 4.4, you will work with the upgrade.properties file included in the NBIA_upgrade_4_5.zip. For more information about upgrading NBIA, see Upgrade Using Command-Line Installer on page 30.
Overview of Properties Files	When you installed the previous version of NBIA 4.4, you configured the install.properties. The NBIA_upgrade_4_5.zip that you must download to perform the upgrade to 4.5 includes another properties file, upgrade.properties. To complete the upgrade to NBIA 4.5, you should use the values in the install.properties to configure values in the upgrade installer wizard GUI, or the upgrade.properties file if you are doing a command-line method of upgrade.

See the steps below for more information.

In several instances in this section, property values must be modified. Note the following points about changing or entering variables.

Paths in .properties Files

Spaces in Property Values



You should not put any spaces in the property values of *.properties files (e.g. install.properties). In Windows, note that the C:\Documents and Settings\<username> path contains spaces and the installation will likely fail. If you are using Windows, use a path such as C:/apps/NBIA.

Upgrading NBIA 4.4 to 4.5

This section describes how to upgrade your product from NBIA 4.4 to NBIA 4.5. The instructions in this section apply only if you have already installed NBIA version 4.4.x.

You can perform an upgrade installation of NBIA v.4.5 using either of these two methods:

- A GUI Installation wizard. Instructions for this method begin on this page.
- A command-line installation. For instructions, see page 29.

Before You Begin	• Important: Backup the 4.4 database. You need to create a reliable copy of your entire NBIA database—the DDL and DML.
	• Important: Backup the jboss.home directory. To do this, make a copy of the NBIA.home folder along with any artifacts from the initial installation, such as the property files, already mentioned.

If you are performing a new installation, go directly to the installation of version 4.5, <u>Installing</u> <u>NBIA 4.5 Application and Services</u>, on page 8.

	• The directions in this section presume that you have a valid and functioning NBIA 4.4. That assumes that Java SDK, Apache Ant and MySQL have all been successfully uploaded and installed, as described on page 3 in this document.
NBIA 4.4 Users Upgrading to NBIA 4.5	 The upgrade to NBIA 4.5 adds new constraints to the data model. This is done in order to stop erroneous submissions from happening. If such submissions have already occurred, there may already be duplicate or corrupt data in the database. The upgrade will fail in such a case, and the corrupt data needs to be cleaned out before the upgrade can be successful.

Upgrading NBIA Using the GUI Installer

Overview of Properties Files When you installed the previous version of NBIA 4.4, you configured the install.properties. The NBIA_upgrade_4_5.zip that you must download to perform the upgrade to 4.5 includes another properties file, upgrade.properties. To complete the upgrade to NBIA 4.5, you must use values in the install.properties to configure values in the upgrade installer wizard GUI, or the upgrade.properties file if you are doing a command-line method of upgrade.


Upgrading NBIA Using Command-Line Installer

To perform an upgrade to NBIA 4.5 using the command-line, follow these steps.

Step	Action
1	From the directory where you downloaded the upgrade zip file, extract the files, using one of these two methods:
	a. Open a command prompt and use it to extract this file to a temporary location. For example, you may enter a command such as unzip -q NBIA_upgrade_4_5.zip. (You must have a ZIP tool installed).
	Note: It is recommended that you use a new directory for the unzipped files, rather than the one you used to unzip the installer for the previous version(s) of NBIA. This location will be referred to as the <upgrade_installer_directory> henceforth.</upgrade_installer_directory>
	b. Use WinZip or a similar utility to unzip the files to a temporary location. This location will be referred to as the <upgrade_installer directory=""> henceforth</upgrade_installer>
	<pre>Example <upgrade_installer directory=""> = C:\NBIA41_upgrade_installer</upgrade_installer></pre>

Step	Action
2	Edit the default properties in the <upgrade_installer_directory>/build/upgrade.properties file. To do so, open both properties files, the one you configured originally when you installed the previous version of NBIA 4.4.x. (<install properties<br="">file>) and the <upgrade_installer_directory>/build /upgrade.properties file.</upgrade_installer_directory></install></upgrade_installer_directory>
	Note: Where there are duplicate attributes, the values must be the same in both files.
	Copy each entry you modified in the 4.5 installation file and paste it in the corresponding location in the upgrade.properties file, replacing the default text, as appropriate. All the properties that appear in upgrade.properties appear in install.properties (but not vice versa). Consult the Command-Line Method of Installation of this guide on page 20 for more background on the meaning of the properties.
	Record these property values.
3	Note: You should not need to modify the other default values as we have chosen unique ports to reduce the risk of other applications using the same values. However, be sure to check the *.properties to verify that the ports in this file are not being used by other applications.
4	From the command line, navigate to <upgrade_installer_directory>/ (<i>Example</i>:cd C:\NBIA42_upgrade_installer), and type <i>ant</i>. This initiates the upgrade process. The anticipated duration is anywhere 7-15 minutes depending on your system's speed, power and memory.</upgrade_installer_directory>
	The installer upgrades your existing NBIA database on your MySQL server, starts your existing JBoss servers and starts up the grid service for the NBIA application.
	Notes regarding upgrade:
	When the installer detects that a database exists, it warns you to back it up, which you were instructed to do earlier in this process. Press \mathbf{Y} to proceed.
5	To verify NBIA installation, open your web browser to http:// <jboss.server.hostname>.<jboss.server.port>/NBIA (example: http://imaging.nci.nih.gov/NBIA) and enter <i>nciadevtest</i> as the user and <i>changeme</i> as the password. Refer to the original install.properties for the correct jboss.server.hostname and jboss.server.port values.</jboss.server.port></jboss.server.hostname>

Configuring JBoss



For optimal performance, you must modify your JBoss 4.0.5 configuration to increase the amount of available memory for the NBIA application. Directions for doing this in Windows are in the following step 1.

To configure JBoss in Windows, follow these steps:

	Warning : Be careful when copying and pasting from this document, whether PDF or MS Word. No spaces must come before and after the columns. A safe way to ensure that the text has no unwanted space and unwanted characters is to copy the text into a blank text editor such as NotePad first. Correct the spacing, then copy and paste back into the run.bat file.
2	Restart your JBoss 4.0.5 server for the changes to take effect. The method of doing this may depend on the start/stop/restart scripts you created after the installation. Most commonly, you can execute shutdown.bat and then run.bat under \$JBOSS_HOME/bin. Refer to the publicly available JBoss user's guide at www.jboss.org for more information.

Configuring JBoss Servers and MySQL Server to Run as Services

NOTE	MySQL, and the two JBoss servers that make up NBIA, and the JBoss server optionally installed for UPT, must run continually as services. The instructions in this section cover all of these scenarios. For a NBIA 4.5 deployment, there are at least four servers, and if UPT is installed, five servers:
	JBoss 4.0.5 (for NBIA application and grid service)
	• MySQL 5.0.27
	CTP (Clinical Trial Processor)



The default NBIA installation runs JBoss as a command line process using the user currently logged on. Therefore, when you log out as this user, JBoss is no longer available for NBIA. For that reason, it is recommended that you configure your JBoss servers to run as a Linux or Windows service. The instructions are contained in this section.


